More husbandry by the Council: you may have noticed that some sapling trees have been planted in the gaps along the long path. These are Italian Alder. According to the RHS¹ they are 'majestic, conical, hardy deciduous trees reaching 15 - 25m in height. The glossy leaves may remain as late as December'.
